


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

NEWS RELEASE: RESIGNATION OF BISHOP FREDERICK HENRY

In accordance with canon 401 § ii of the Code of Canon Law, his Holiness Pope Francis has accepted the resignation of Most Reverend Frederick B. Henry as Bishop of the Diocese of Calgary due to health concerns.

Most Rev. Luigi Bonazzi, Apostolic Nuncio to Canada, ANNOUNCES THAT THE HOLY FATHER HAS NAMED BISHOP WILLIAM TERRENCE MCGRATTAN, currently the Bishop of the Diocese of Peterborough, as his successor.

The installation of the new Bishop will be on Monday, February 27, 2017 at 7:30 p.m. which will be at St. Mary's Cathedral.

In the meantime, Bishop Henry has been named Apostolic Administrator of the Diocese of Calgary.

We thank Bishop Henry for his unstinting service, and we welcome Bishop McGrattan to our Diocese.

Today I announced a set of new measures to help Alberta students with Mathematics. These changes are part of the Government's Future Ready initiative, and our aim is to ensure students have the skills they need to succeed in their future educational and career pursuits.

We will soon be making available bursaries up to \$2,000 per teacher to help cover tuition costs for post-secondary courses designed to strengthen their knowledge, skill and confidence in teaching mathematics.

These bursaries will be available to both pre-service and current teachers. Details on the bursary program are still being finalized, and Deputy Minister Clarke will be following up with you in the coming weeks with more details.

Starting in the 2018/19 school year, we will also be adjusting our provincial assessments to re-emphasize some student skills. Starting with the Mathematics 30-1 and 30-2 diploma exams, we will be re-introducing a written response component to ensure students can show their work. We will also introduce a non-calculator portion to the Grade 9 Mathematics Provincial Achievement Test.

Some of these changes were recommended by a Mathematics Review Working Group, which was made up of post-secondary and high-school math educators. Their report, including six recommendations for improving Mathematics education in Alberta, is available on our website.

Our Government is committed to building a strong future for our students and all Albertans, and I look forward to continuing to work with you to ensure our students' math skills are part of the strong foundation for that future.

Dear Mr Mastel,

The Electoral Boundaries Commission was appointed on October 31, 2016, and is beginning its work. The next year will be spent reviewing the boundaries and names of the 87 electoral constituencies in the province, in accordance with legal requirements, including those set out in the *Electoral Boundaries Commission Act*. The results of this review will impact your vote in future provincial elections.

In addition to myself, as Chair, the Commission members are Gwen Day from the County of Mountain View, Laurie Livingstone of Calgary, D. Jean Munn of Calgary, and W. Bruce McLeod of Acme.

One of the most important aspects of this review is hearing from interested Albertans who wish to contribute to the redrawing of Alberta's constituency map. I encourage you to participate in this public consultation. You may participate by preparing a written submission or by making a presentation at one of the public hearings, the dates and locations of which will soon be announced. Please visit our website at abebc.ca for information as to how and when you may take part as we travel throughout the province gathering feedback on how best to update the constituency map of Alberta.

Our interim report will be submitted to the Speaker of the Legislative Assembly before May 31, 2017, and our final report will be submitted by October 31, 2017. There will be an opportunity for public input again after the interim report is submitted to the Speaker.

Dear Minister Larivee:

Re: Modernized Municipal Government Act - School Sites

St. Paul Education is pleased that you are taking additional time to review changes to the Municipal Government Act. We have participated in various stakeholder sessions and appreciate the opportunity to provide input.

Of particular concern is that the responsibility for serviced land for school sites has not been adequately defined. The Municipal Government Act is not clear in terms of who has the responsibility of providing a school site when insufficient reserve property exists. We have experienced this very issue on more than one occasion and it is a matter that should be clarified in the amended Act.

Small rural municipalities often do not have enough development to provide sufficient reserve land for a suitable school site. This places a school division in a quandary of possibly having to purchase land for a site. Purchasing a site is only part of the expense, as site servicing then becomes an issue. In rural areas, the added servicing likely includes a substantial cost for water, sewer and roadways. As the Province does not fund school sites when building a school, this is a significant unfunded expense.

I would like to suggest that the Province clarify the responsibilities of all parties (municipality, school board, Province) in obtaining and developing a school site. Ideally this would be detailed in the MGA along with the municipal reserve provisions. Our recommendation would be that, where a suitable site does not exist and that normal reserve provisions have been respected, obtaining and developing a site be included in the supported costs of a school project.

I thank you for your consideration and would welcome the opportunity to discuss further with yourself or other ministry representatives.



1. CCSSA Marks of an Excellent Catholic Leader

The attached CCSSA Marks of an Excellent Catholic Leader document was approved as a CCSSA resource at the November 17 CCSSA meeting. The document will be reviewed with the Division Leadership Team at the January DLT meeting.

Purpose of the Document

The document has been created as a supplementary resource for leaders in Catholic Education. Building on the document The Excellent Catholic Teacher (CCSSA, 2015), The Marks of an Excellent Catholic Leader begins with the premise that superb Catholic school leaders are also master Catholic teachers. While embracing the essence of teaching excellence, this treatise goes beyond teaching to address the roles and responsibilities of both Catholic school and Catholic district leaders.

HOW MIGHT THIS DOCUMENT SERVE CATHOLIC SCHOOLS IN ALBERTA?

This Catholic leadership framework may be used to:

- Inspire Catholic leaders in their service of Catholic education
- Offer a role description for Catholic leaders
- Provide indicators and offer exemplars
- Create conversations around Catholic leadership
- Assist leaders as they strive for excellence in their vocation
- Serve as a resource when identifying, recruiting and hiring Catholic school leaders



The concrete floor will be poured in the Gymnasium followed by Ventilation Ducting, Electrical and Lighting Installation, Flooring, Bleachers, Backboards and Divider Curtain. Work continues on the main floor of the North Wing with new Change Rooms, Washrooms, Classrooms and Kinesiology Lab including the installation of the elevator. The next phase will see heavy demolition of the existing Weight Room and transformation of the small gymnasium into additional Student Gathering Space along with a new Ancillary Gymnasium and Exercise Facility. The CTS Shop will be modernized during the last phase of the project. Modernization completion is proposed for the spring of 2017.

WHEREAS the Electoral Ward Bylaw 2010/01 needed to be updated with respect to the boundaries of the regional division;

WHEREAS the Board of Trustees of the Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education is desirous of replacing the bylaw to reflect the correct boundaries for the division and to have one electoral ward with an increase to the number of trustees in Ward 1;

WHEREAS the Bow Island Roman Catholic Separate School District No. 82 (Ward 2) was withdrawn from the Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education under Ministerial Order 012/2014;

WHEREAS the School Act of Alberta, specifically section 262, allows the Board of a division, with the approval of the Minister, to authorize the determination of boundaries for wards.

WHEREAS the School Act of Alberta, specifically section 247, allows the Minister to vary the number of trustees to be elected for each ward;

WHEREAS the Board of Trustees for the Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education has undergone a public consultation process for increasing the number of trustees and to retain the same boundaries for the remaining ward;

NOW THEREFORE, be it resolved that, in accordance with Section 262 of the School Act and subject to the approval of the Minister, adjustment to be made to the Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education wards as follows with such wards to be in effect for the October 2017 trustee elections:

1. <u>Electoral Ward 1</u> (The Medicine Hat Roman Catholic Separate School District No. 21 Ward) shall be comprised of the following lands:

REQUEST TO ADD A TRUSTEE POSITION

The Board of Trustees for the Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education would formally request that under section 247 of the *School Act* the number of trustees for the Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education be increased from four to five effective for the October 2017 school board elections.

The Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education previously had five trustees within the regional division where four trustees were allocated to Ward 1, encompassing the boundaries of the Medicine Hat Roman Catholic Separate School District No. 21 and one trustee was allocated to Ward 2, encompassing the boundaries of the Bow Island Roman Catholic Separate School District No. 82. As a result of a ward withdrawal process, Bow Island Roman Catholic Separate School District No. 82 was removed from The Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education on September 1, 2014 and added to the Holy Spirit Roman Catholic Separate Regional Division No. 4 under Ministerial Order 012/2014. This left Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education with four trustees.

The Board of Trustees for the Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education have continued to operate with the four trustees, however, there has always been a desire since the ward withdrawal process to return to having five trustees. The primary reasons allow for a more effective distribution of work amongst the trustees and for more diverse discussion on issues with the additional voice. As well, with four trustees there continues to be concerns on split votes, with one split vote having occurred early in the trustees' mandate.

When we compared our board composition to other similar sized jurisdictions we found that Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education is significantly underrepresented in comparison.

The Board of Trustees desire to have all the trustees elected at large with no electoral subdivisions. This allows the Board of Trustees to serve the regional division as a whole as opposed to having trustees focus on certain electoral subdivisions. The boundaries for the regional division are not excessively large and both the Redcliff and Dunmore rural communities are within minutes of the City of Medicine Hat. An examination of the demographics of the regional division revealed the following:

With the rural population encompassing 10.5% of the population having a trustee allocated for the rural population may result with overrepresentation assuming each of the five trustees would be representing 20% of the population. Of the rural residents, 85% live within the towns of Redcliff and Dunmore. All residents would continue to be eligible to run as a trustee whether they were urban or rural residents.

Another driver for not moving towards electoral subdivisions, either with rural or urban subdivision, is that in the last school board election all trustees were acclaimed. Creating electoral subdivisions within the regional division further increases the likelihood there could be vacancies in certain electoral subdivisions. Continuing to having trustees elected at large minimizes that risk.

The Board of Trustees engaged in an active public consultation process regarding these changes. This included the following:

- The Board of Trustees consulted the Parent Association, which is a council of all Medicine Hat Catholic school councils. Feedback from this group was positive towards the proposal.
- The Division Leadership Team, consisting of the school based administrators and other division administrators, was consulted and feedback was neutral except for the potential costs related to an additional trustee.

- A message was sent home to all parents through the student backpack distribution. This
 outlined the proposal and inviting them to the public meeting as well as providing links to obtain
 more information from the division website and ways to provide feedback. One response was
 received which was positive towards the proposal.
- A public meeting was held on December 13, 2016. Two individuals attended and no feedback was left. This meeting was widely advertised including through the Medicine Hat News.
- Both the Facebook and Twitter accounts for Medicine Hat Catholic were used to advertise the public meeting and provide inks to obtain more information.
- The Division's website was used to communicate information and seek responses.
- Both parishes provided information on the proposal and the public meeting through their weekly bulletins to Catholics.
- The Medicine Hat News and CHAT TV both reported on the proposal which further advertised the proposal to stakeholders.

Attached is a package with further details on the public consultation undertaken.

The Board of Trustees for the Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education have passed a by-law, subject to your approval on adding the fifth trustee. The Board formally requests that under section 247 of the *School Act* the number of trustees for the Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education be increased from four to five effective for the October 2017 school board elections.





POPE FRANCIS In Advent, It is important to reflect on Hope

At his General Audience on Wednesday, Pope Francis began a new series of catechesis on "Christian Hope".

In our times, which seem so dark, the Pope said we often feel flost in the face of the wickedness and the violence that surround us." We may even feel "discouraged, because we feel powerless, and it seems the darkness might never end."

But we should never give up hope, he continued, "because God, with His love, journeys with us, He does not leave us alone, and the Lord Jesus has overcome evil, and opened up the path of life."

It is important to reflect on hope during this season of Advent, when we prepare for the coming of Christ at Christmas. Pope Francis based his reflection primarily on a passage from Isaiah, in which God tells the prophet, first, to console his people, and then to "make straight the path of the Lord."

This prophetic message was addressed to the people of Israel when they were living the tragedy of the exile in Babylon, when they had been taken out of their own land and deprived of their freedom and dignity, and even their trust in God. But the call of the prophet, the Pope said, "opens their hearts anew to faith." It is precisely in the desert that they hear his call, it is precisely there that a new journey "can be made in order to return not only to their homeland, but to God."

This passage, Pope Francis continued, was the starting point for the preaching of John the Baptist, "a voice crying out in the desert, prepare the way of the Lord." In Jesus time, the Israelites were once again living a kind of exile, living as strangers in their own land because of the oppression of the Romans. But it was not the powerful who made history, the Pope continued; rather, history is the story of what God has done together with his little ones, people like Zechariah and Elizabeth, Mary, and the shepherds, the simple, humble people who gathered around Jesus at his birth. "These are the little ones," Pope Francis said, made great by their faith," the little ones who know that they must keep hope alive.

"Let us allow ourselves, then," the Pope concluded, "to teach hope, to faithfully await the coming of the Lord, and whatever desert we might have in our life will become a flowering garden."

This week the two sisters of Divine Mercy led us through the Advent Parish Mission. They said that it's as easy as ABC to live a life in the Divine Mercy. A: ask for Mercy; B: be merciful and C: complete trust. They just

proclaimed the eternal truth. They are the image of John the Baptist.

He was quite a sight, this John the Baptist. He wore clothes of camel hair, and had a leather belt around his waist. His food was locusts and wild honey. He told people things that they may not have wanted to hear. He called people sinners, and yet they crowded around him. They went out into the desert to hear him. John the Baptist was so popular that his message was carried throughout the Roman Empire at that time. And now John was in jail, in King Herod's prison to be exact. He was there because he did what he had been doing all along: proclaiming the truth regardless of the ramifications.

The people at Jesus' time wanted the truth. It attracted them. John fascinated them, because he was not afraid of the truth. Human history is cyclical, not progressive, at least in this matter. People are no wiser now than they were back in Jesus' day. Technology has advanced. Wisdom has retreated. The way that people form their own concepts of reality was no different in Jesus' day than it is now. People are still molding facts to suit their desires and needs. People are still using religion for their own personal gain. The truth is still very hard to find in our world.

Consider this, we have witnessed family, friends and neighbors twisting truths to justify every abominable action imaginable. I know you might not believe this, but I have spoken to a betrayed wife who was told by her husband that his actions really weren't adulterous because they involved a prostitute, or cyber pornography, not someone he was in love with. A drug user justified his action by claiming that drug helped him cope with family challenges! Some named a dictator who murdered thousands of his people a "remarkable leader!" But these are extremes. Far more important, as I have mentioned before, many people have discarded the belief that we will be judged by God according to our actions. The concept of universal laws has been rejected. It is brushed aside by a misuse of the word "values" so that the Ten Commandments have really been turned into the ten suggestions. People even within the Church have adopted the rhetoric of the pro-medical assisted suicide as a death with dignity or the proabortionists, speaking about a women's choice for an abortion as an excuse for killing babies. Imagine if Mary and Joseph, in dealing with their anxiety at the incarnation of Christ, had an abortion what would have happened?

There are very good people in our day, in our society, just as there were very good people in Jesus' day, in Jesus' society. There are good people who have had enough of the perversion of truth. They are attracted to anyone who will stand for the truth, regardless of whether it is popular or not, whether it is convenient or not, whether it is politically correct or not. Good people just want the truth. They don't want a reed bent by the wind. They want a John the Baptist who will die rather than sway from the truth.

Why do we practice our faith? Why do we come to Church? Do we come to hear a priest saying whatever we want to hear? Do we come because we want someone to tell us

that sin doesn't exist, or that maybe for us this or that sin doesn't really matter? Or are we attracted to the Church because we want to hear the truth no matter how popular or unpopular it may be?

I am convinced that we go to Church because we are the people of goodwill, who want to be better people. I am convinced that we go to Church because we are sinners and like the people who went out into the desert to see John the Baptist, we are attracted by the truth. I am convinced that we go to Church because, like the people of Jesus' day, we are disgusted with those elements of society that pervert truth to serve their own needs. More than this, I am convinced that all of us want to be freed of the darkness within ourselves that threatens to enslave us in our own selfishness. The truth alone can set us free as the Master said in John 8: 32. And the One who carries the truth to us is the Baby born more than 2000 years ago, but his truth still echoes in his community. The question is "Do we have the courage to listen to him or not?"



AUDITED FINANCIAL STATEMENT, FALL BUDGET & AERR APPROVED - The Board approved the 2015/16 Audited Financial Statement, the 2016/17 Fall Budget Update and the 2016/19 Annual Education Results Report & Three Year Education Plan at a Special Board Meeting on Nov 23, 2016. Approved documents can be found on the website at www.mhcbe.ab.ca under Resources (Plans & Reports) & (Finance).

SCHOOL ED PLAN PRESENTATIONS- This year, each of our 9 Catholic Schools will present their 2016/17 School Education Plans to the Board. St. Michael's School & Notre Dame Academy presented their plans at the November Board meeting. The Schools focused their presentation on the integration of the Division's 7 Strategic Priorities:

- Increasing Student Engagement by foster and developing relationships between students, parents, staff, parish and community;
- To Enhance Catholic Identity;
- 3. To enhance student learning through actions that reflect the values of inclusive education:
- Provide a welcoming, caring, respectful and safe learning environment;
- 5. To enhance and foster a love of the fine arts;
- 6. To foster the Catholic spirit of athletics;
- To develop a vision for the use of technology support student

Thank you to the staff, parents & students at St. Michael's School and Notre Dame Academy; the Board is impressed with your commitment and the exceptional work being done at your schools to integrate the strategic priorities.

ACADEMY NOTRE DAME OUTDOOR FITNESS CENTRE-A proposal to construct an outdoor fitness centre at Notre Dame Academy in the amount of \$50,000 was presented to the Board. The Board tabled the discussion for the December 2016 Board meeting.

PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT-PD continues to be a focus in the Division. Recently, Teachers & Support Staff attended a session facilitated by Dr. Jodi Carrington on relationship-based assessment. Teaching staff & Administration met with representatives from AB Education in a Provincial Curriculum Development Engagement Session to gain insight into the province's K-12 curriculum redesign. Instructional Leadership sessions are being held throughout the year for school-based administration to focus on literacy, numeracy, Catholicity, high school re-design & classroom management.

MENTAL HEALTH SUMMIT- Leaders from within our education & community partners, including staff from Med Hat Catholic Schools, recently held a Mental Health Summit. The focus was to review our practices on how we support the mental health needs of students. We looked at our current model, our resources and community support, including identifying gaps in service delivery. We focused on stress factors, promotion of mental health, reducing stress at school and parent education.



PROCEDURE 505 SCHOOL FEES

2016 - 2017 School Fees

(Instructional Materials, Supplies & Resources)

As provided in the School Act (60), the Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education will assess schools fees in order to recover the costs of certain materials, supplies & resources. The Division will endeavor to keep school fees to a minimum.

Agenda Item: Severe Funding and Support

Every spring we go through what we call a "severe file review". This is where schools can submit cases for review for Learning Assistance support.

Schools will submit the following for each student they feel will need extra assistance for the coming school year:

- 1. Student Needs Assessment
- 2. Matrix for Support
- 3. Summary of School Functioning

Once this information is received, students are evaluated and measured for their level of need and level of adult assistance required for them to function in the learning environment. A meeting then happens with the school to discuss class sizes, clustering of students, class composition (#'s of students with 50 codes = 252), and possible best Learning Assistant match.

From here we allocate support across the division based on the needs of the students. Based on the factors listed above, support is allocated from a minimum of 3 hours/day to 6 hours/day.

Currently we have 73 students that meet the Special Education coding Criteria set out by Alberta Education for a code 40 allocation. We currently fund 43 FTE's of support to meet the needs of this population.

Special Education Coding Criteria outlines criteria within specific categories to help teachers and administrators in school authorities to identify those Early Childhood Services (ECS) children/students who require specialized supports and services. The need for specialized supports and services may be determined at any time. Schools need to have the documentation to support the assignment of a special education code. This includes a diagnosis of a disability or disorder by a qualified professional. In addition to this diagnosis,

it is essential to have a clear indication of how the disability/disorder affects the ECS child's/student's learning in an educational environment.

This process of file review is evaluated annually by the Learning Services Advisory Committee to see if it most accurately supports our students.
