Alberta Student Transportation Survey



Message from the Minister of Education to Alberta families,

Student transportation is an integral part of the education system. Our government continues to support a safe transportation system for approximately 300,000 Kindergarten to Grade 12 students across the province.

We are listening to families and school boards to make sure we update the student transportation eligibility criteria to make life better for Alberta students.

Alberta Education has already made progress to better understand the varied transportation challenges faced throughout the province by working with key stakeholder groups.

To share your thoughts and priorities on the student transportation criteria, please fill out our **online survey**.

In addition to the survey, your board or stakeholder organization is welcome and encouraged to provide a written submission to my department. Written submissions can be sent via email to Rick Grebenstein, Senior Transportation Manager, Business Operations and Stakeholder Support Branch, at rick.grebenstein@gov.ab.ca.

The survey and written submissions will help determine the potential changes to the distance criteria and mandated service levels and any safety considerations that may be added.

The survey will close on June 15, 2018. The deadline for written submissions is also June 15, 2018. Changes are scheduled to be finalized by fall 2018.

This timeline will give parents and school authorities an appropriate amount of time – approximately 10 months – to adjust to the new requirements, which will be implemented in the 2019/20 school year.

Superintendent's Report May 15th 2018

Regular meeting

1. Nutrition program 2018-19

Funding for the Nutrition program has been confirmed for the 2018-2019 school year. We will be receiving an additional \$25,000 making our total 166,000. We are grateful for the increase. We are now beginning the process of developing the Nutrition program for 2018-2019 school year and are looking at how we might be able to expand the program. One of the school based administrators will be the main contact for the District as we develop the plan for next year.

We had a video conference with the Alberta Education Nutrition Coordinators on May 10th. Requirements were discussed including

- Year-end reporting requirements and timelines
- Operational Requirements for 2018/19
- On-line resource sharing

We will keep the Board and administrators informed as we move forward. We hope to have completed our plan by early June.

Recommendation: Receive as information

2. Classroom Improvement Fund - 2018-19

On April 26, 2018, Education Minister David Eggen announced that the Classroom Improvement Fund (CIF) has been included in the 2018-19 budget and this program will be continued for the next year while central table bargaining continues between the Teachers' Employer Bargaining Association and the Alberta Teachers' Association.

Each school jurisdiction will receive at least as much funding as was allocated for the 2017-18 school year. Additional information on grant requirements, proposal and approval processes, and timelines will be communicated shortly.

3. Bishop William T. McGrattan - Bishops Dinner 2018

The 2018 Bishop's Dinner will be held on Friday, October 19, 2018 at the Telus Convention Centre. Bishop McGrattan is pleased to announce that this year's focus is Youth and the net proceeds of this event will be allocated to support school programs throughout the Diocese.

The Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education proposal allows every student in Medicine Hat Catholic to benefit. The title of our proposal is Catholic School Retreats – Creating an Opportunity for Students to Encounter Christ. Our proposal is directly linked to our Strategic Priority #1 *To Enhance Catholic identity*.

Our Catholic faith will be celebrated through music, activities, keynote talks and prayer developed for each age group.

The Catholic school retreats will leave each student enriched by an encounter with Christ. Our outcomes include:

- Students develop a closer relationship with God through prayer and music
- Students are surrounded with a faith-filled environment
- Students encounter Christ
- Student engagement and participation is evident in school and parish based Catholic activities such as masses, celebrations and social justice.

4. Strategic Planning Session

The 2018-2019 MHCBE Strategic Planning session is tentatively set for **June 6th from 4-7 pm.** Light supper provided.

The Strategic Planning session provides an opportunity for stakeholders to articulate the strategic priorities for the district. Representatives from stakeholder groups will include trustees, senior administration, central office staff, school based administration, teachers and parents. As a group we:

- Will review the strategic priorities set for the current school year, and discuss indicators of success.
- Review Alberta Education priorities
- Complete a SWOT analysis

Based on the responses, the stakeholder groups will brainstorm themes. The information collected will be used to develop District Strategic Priorities for 2018-2019. The Strategic Priorities will become the focus for the MHCBE 3 year plan (2018-2021) and for School Based Annual Plans for the 2018-2019 school year.

5. Educational Agent Familiarization Tour of Alberta

Public Alerting System Test



Albertans can now receive messages about life-threatening emergencies, such as a tornado, wildfire, flood or Amber Alert, directly to their cellphones. Wireless public alerting is a national system that will send life-saving emergency alert messages directly to compatible smart phones connected to an LTE network within an area affected by a disaster or emergency.

On May 9, 2018 at 1:55 p.m., the wireless public alerting system will send out a test alert across Alberta. During the test, an alert sound will go off on compatible cellphones with a message letting the cellphone user know that the sound is part of a test, and there is no need for concern. If the cellphone is switched off or on silent mode, there will be no sound, but a banner will be displayed and the phone may vibrate even if the phone is in silent mode. To hear

what sound to expect during the test, visit www.alertready.ca and click on the box at the bottom of the page that says - "play alert tone."

As this test alert will take place during the school day, ensure that schools are made aware of it.

The new wireless system complements Alberta's Emergency Alert system. Wireless Public Alerts are delivered directly to compatible cellphones. 

3. Locally Developed Courses

Locally Developed Courses are courses created by other Alberta school districts. The Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education has re-requested approval from the originator, Calgary Roman Catholic Separate School District No. 1, the Learning Strategies course presently offered at Monsignor McCoy High School.

Learning Strategies is a course designed to assist high school students in developing understandings, literacies, skills and values to be successful learners across all subject areas. This course directly involves students in response to their needs and in respect to their courses of study. In collaboration with teachers, educational assistants, peers and parents, support is engaged and strategies are introduced, developed and applied. Progressively, students gain confidence, realize independence and achieve success in subject areas.

The content of the Learning Strategies course is organized through five major topics: Understanding Self and Others as Learners, Organization and Management of Time and Resources (Human & Material), Understanding the Learning Process, Responding to Assessment and Evaluation, and Self-Advocacy and Relationship Management in the School Setting.

Recommendation: That the Board of Trustees for the Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education authorizes Monsignor McCoy High School to offer the Locally Developed Course titled: Learning Strategies 15, 25, 35 in 3 & 5 credit courses beginning in September 2018 as acquired from Calgary Roman Catholic Separate School District No. 1 from September 1, 2018 to August 31, 2022.

The Medicine Hat Police Service

Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education, a regional school authority in the Province of Alberta (hereinafter referred to as the "Division")

WHEREAS the Medicine Hat Police Service of the City of Medicine Hat (hereinafter referred to as the "Service") is prepared to provide the services of one police officer to act as a School Resource Officer (hereinafter referred to as a "SRO"), and;

WHEREAS schools of the Division located within the City (hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Schools") have committed to provide funds to the City to assist in the costs of this position;

NOW THEREFORE the parties, in consideration of the terms and conditions herein, agree as follow:

- The Service will provide the services of one officer to the Division as an SRO.
 The officer will work full time within the Division, predominately at Monsignor McCoy High School.
- 2. The SRO will be a member of the Service and will report to and be under the supervision of the Chief of Police of the Service (hereinafter referred to as the "Chief of Police").
- 3. With the advice of the Principals of the Schools, the Chief of Police will establish the overall goals and objectives for the SRO Program (hereinafter referred to as the "Program") and set out a position description for the SRO. The SRO in consultation with the Chief of Police and the Principals of the Schools will, on an ongoing basis, establish detailed objectives and plans for the Program.
- 4. The SRO Officer will be available for services to the Division on a full time basis and will be present in the school or otherwise engaged in the activities of the Program within the Division on school days, unless involved in training, court or other necessary police responsibilities. Vacation leave, other leaves and absences will be taken wherever possible at times when the Division is not open for students.

- 5. For certain events, including such things as school dances and major sporting events, the SRO Officer may adjust the hours and days of work, where possible, in order to attend these functions.
- 6. The Service recognizes the importance of programming at the primary and middle schools and agrees to continue programming such as E.P.I.C. (Encouraging Positive Informed Choices) or other similar programs and that this programming will be conducted by other members of the Service at no cost to the Division. This additional programming will not be conducted by the SRO Officer assigned to the Secondary School.
- 7. The term of this agreement will be September 1, 2018 to August 31, 2019.
- 8. In consideration of this agreement the Division will contribute approximately forty nine percent (49%) of an officer's wages and benefits, which is based on the most recent contractual First Class Constable rate of pay.
- 9. For the term of this Agreement, the Division will make payment to the City of Medicine Hat in one (1) installment. The payment of \$60,806.29 is due on or before May 31, 2019. The rates are based on the 2016 Medicine Hat Police Association Collective Agreement (Appendix A).
- 10. Where the position remains unfilled due to a vacancy in staffing the position, the contribution required of the Division shall be reduced proportionately.
- 11. Either party, upon six (6) months written notice to the other party, may terminate the agreement.
- 12. The parties agree to take such further steps as are reasonably required to give effect this agreement.


SCHEDULE "A"

- 4) The hallways, passages and stairs of the building in which the premises are situated shall be used for no purpose other than going to and from the premises and the Tenant shall not in any way encumber those areas with boxes, furniture or other material or place or leave rubbish in those areas and other areas used in common with other tenants.
- Neither the Tenant nor the Landlord shall add to or change locks on doors giving access to the premises or to any building or property of which the premises form a part without prior written consent of the other party.
- 6) No floor hockey is permitted in the premises.
- 7) The Tenant must keep and observe all health, fire and police regulations of the Province and city, town or municipality in which the premises are located.
- 8) No additional electric wiring or heating units shall be installed in the premises without prior written approval of the Landlord.
- 9) No combustible material or flammable liquid shall be kept on the premises.
- The security system is to be disarmed immediately on entry and shall be rearmed upon departure. The Tenant shall ensure the lights are off and the entrance doors are locked. The Tenant shall be liable for any security callouts after regular working hours if the call out was caused due to the Tenant's action or inaction.

Early Learning Update:

1. Early Learning and Kindergarten PD Day:

The third session in the Early Learning and Kindergarten PD Self-Reg series facilitated by Monica Braat, Inclusive Learning Consultant, was completed on Friday, May 4th. The series was based on the Shanker Method of Self-Reg as follows:

- Read and Reframe the Behaviour
- Recognize the Stressors
- Reduce the Stress
- Reflect: Enhance Stress Awareness
- Respond: Develop Personal Strategies to Reduce Tension and Restore Energy

Discussion topics for team meetings held on May 4th:

- Assessment and documentation in the early learning environment
- Facilitating learning through play
- Changes to age of PUF and Mild/Moderate eligibility to align with changes to kindergarten age of entry planned for September 2020.
- Early Years Guiding Document
- We Thinkers Program

Recommendation: Receive as information

2. Get Outside and Play Week: This is a week long, provincial celebration of outdoor play in the early years being promoted by the Alberta Council for Environmental Education (ACEE) during the week of May 26-June 3, 2018.

Christina Pickles, Provincial Program Manager with ACEE says: "There is no doubt that unstructured outdoor play is decreasing – and that spells trouble for our society. We need to give children a chance to develop a relationship to nature and their communities and the only way to do this is to get outside!"
