

SHOULD THE MHCBE OFFER THE ADMINISTERING OF THE HUMAN PAPILLOMA VIRUS (HPV) VACCINATION IN OUR SCHOOLS?

The Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education passed the following motion at its regularly scheduled public board meeting held December 11, 2012.

"That the Board of Trustees for the Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education directs the Superintendent of Schools to commence a consultation process with parents to receive their feedback with respect to offering the administering of the HPV Vaccine in our Division Schools for the Board's further consideration". Carried.

BACKGROUND:

- Alberta Health Services began offering the HPV vaccine to eligible students in 2008 as part of the school vaccination program. This particular vaccine has not been offered in MHCBE schools, however other vaccination programs through Alberta Health Services offered in your schools.
- We looked to our Catholic leaders for moral and spiritual guidance and Bishop Frederick Henry indicated in 2008 he would not support the HPV vaccine being offered at Catholic schools. The Bishop is now, however, supportive of MHCBE proceeding with this parent consultation process.
- Regardless of whether or not MHCBE allows the vaccine to be administered at our schools, allowing children to
 receive vaccines is, and will continue to be, a parental decision. Parents always have the choice to opt out of any
 vaccine program for their child. Parents are currently able to access the HPV vaccine at health clinics for eligible
 students.
- It has been MHCBE's process to distribute a letter to parents with information which outlines how parents can access the HPV vaccine if they chose to do so.
- MHCBE's consultation process has evolved since the Board of Trustees original decision in 2008 to not allow the HPV vaccine to be administered in our schools. At that time, the Board made the best decision with the information it had available. The Board has now directed administration to consult with our parents to ensure the right decision is made moving forward with new information and research that has recently been made public.
- Bishop Henry stated, "Our claim has never been, despite the characterization of our opinion, "being vaccinated
 against cervical cancer makes girls more promiscuous." "What we have repeatedly said is that we should be dealing
 with causes, not just consequences; our youth have to be educated about the nature of human sexuality and Catholic
 moral teaching; informed about risky behavior to their spiritual, emotional, moral and physical health, and sexually
 transmitted diseases; and that we do not want to send any mixed signals about pre-marital sexual activity."

RESEARCH:

- One of the new medical studies made public indicates that girls who had received the HPV vaccine were not
 associated with increased sexual activity.
- Researchers at Kaiser Permanente studied 1,398 girls in the state of Georgia who had been given the vaccine and 905
 who had not, over a three-year period. The group that had been vaccinated did not show increased rates of seeking
 contraceptive advice, having a pregnancy test or getting pregnant, or being diagnosed with a sexually transmitted
 disease. This is good news. However, the nature and results of the study may need to be further examined.
- The HPV infection is common 70% of adults will have HPV at some point in their lives. The infection often clears on
 its own with two years. For some, however, the infection can become chronic, leading to cervical changes, and
 possibly cancer.
- Maureen Markman, at the Cancer Treatment Centre of America in Philadelphia, on September 24, 2012 published in
 PubMed the following abstract stated: "It will likely be more than 20 years before there is unequivocal evidence
 available that HPV vaccination decreases the incidence of invasive cervical cancer. However, existing data strongly
 suggest that as many as 440,000 cervical cancer cases and 220,000 deaths due to this malignancy will be prevented
 with the establishment of an effective worldwide HPV immunization program."

Human Papillomavirus (HPV) Vaccine

What is the human papillomavirus (HPV) vaccine?

HPV vaccine prevents cervical cancer and genital warts. It is much safer for your child to get this vaccine than it is for them to become infected with HPV.

HPV is the name of a family of viruses with over 100 different types that can skin warts, genital warts and certain types of cancer, most commonly cervical cancer. HPV causes about 99% of cervical cancers. HPV infection is very common and is spread through sexual contact. Seven out of ten Canadians can expect to be infected with HPV over their lifetime.

The HPV vaccine provides protection against four types of HPV virus:

- Types 16 and 18 cause about 70% of cervical cancers
- Types 6 and 11 cause about 90% of genital warts

Some HPV infections can lead to changes in the cells of the cervix and cervical cancer. Each year in Alberta, 180 cases of cervical cancer are diagnosed and about 40 women with the disease die.

What are the symptoms of HPV?

Most HPV infections do not cause symptoms and usually go away by themselves. It may take one to two years for the infection to disappear. However, some HPV infections do not go away and can lead to cervical cancer. Cervical cancer is detected by cervical cancer screening with a Pap test.

Who should be immunized with this vaccine?

HPV immunization is offered free of charge to all girls in grade five. The vaccine is given at school as a series of three doses over a six month period. It is administered at the same time as hepatitis B vaccine that is routinely offered to all grade five students in Alberta. Parental or guardian consent is required before the vaccine can be administered to your child at school.

The HPV vaccine is very effective in preventing four types of HPV infection. In studies, highest immune responses were seen in younger girls between nine and 14 years of age. Recent studies have indicated that the HPV vaccine provides good protection for at least five years after immunization. Studies are ongoing to determine if protection will be lifetime or if booster doses will be needed in the future to ensure long-term protection.

Who should not be immunized with this vaccine?

 Anyone who has had a severe allergic reaction (anaphylaxis) to a previous dose, or an ingredient of, the HPV vaccine in the past.

Talk to a public health nurse before getting this vaccine if your child:

- Has any severe allergies.
- Is sick with something more serious than a cold or a fever.
- Has a weakened immune system



Is this vaccine safe?

Yes, this vaccine is safe. Your child cannot get HPV infection from the vaccine. In Canada, vaccines must undergo laboratory and field-testing and pass a rigorous licensing procedure with the federal government before they are introduced. Once a vaccine is approved, every lot is tested for safety and quality. Also, side effects are continuously monitored.

What are the side effects of this vaccine?

Some people may have mild side effects such as pain, redness, itchiness and swelling at the place where the needle was given. Less commonly, a slight fever, nausea, dizziness, headache or vomiting may occur. Side effects are usually mild to moderate and only last for a day or two.

Fainting has infrequently been reported following HPV immunization. Fainting also occurs infrequently with other vaccines particularly when they are given to adolescents.

Severe allergic reactions (anaphylaxis) are rare, occurring at an estimated rate of approximately one report per 1,000,000 doses of vaccines distributed in Canada.

What should you do if your child has a reaction to this vaccine?

- For pain or swelling where the needle was given, apply a cool moist towel to the area for about 15 minutes. Repeat as needed.
- Use acetaminophen (e.g., Tylenol[®] or Tempra[®]) as directed on the bottle if your child has pain or a fever (temperature over 38 C or 100.4 F).

Aspirin[®] (ASA) is not recommended for persons under 18 years of age because of the increased risk of Reye's syndrome.

As with any vaccine, unexpected or unusual reactions can occur. If your child has an unusual reaction, speak with your local public health nurse or call Health Link Alberta:

This phone is answered 24 hours a day, 365 days a year.

Will the vaccine replace cervical cancer screening (Pap tests) in the future?

No, cervical cancer screening is still recommended for women including those who have received the HPV vaccine. Not all types of cervical cancer are caused by HPV types represented in the vaccine. Cervical cancer screening will continue to be important in the early detection of pre-cancerous and cancerous changes to the cervix.





Purpose: Coordinate Possible School Fee Changes for the 2013-14 School Year

Attachments: Present School Fees

Background:	With new programming at various schools and to assist with Religious Education expenses throughout the Division, it is important for us to coordinate the Board approved and Superintendent approved increases in school fees. In accordance with AP 505, School Fees will be reviewed annually.
<u>Recommendation</u>	Elementary Schools – Increase Board Approved Mandatory Fee from \$45.00 to \$50.00 to help cover costs of textbooks. Increase Activity fee from \$4.00 to \$10.00 so that it can include celebration and presentation costs.
	Middle Schools – Increase Board Approved Mandatory Fee from \$72.00 to \$75.00 for textbooks. Add a Religion fee of \$10.00. Increase option fee from \$60.00 to \$100.00 for supplies needed in these CTS and new options.
	High School – Increase Religion Retreat from \$10.00 to \$15.00 and change title to Religion Retreat/Celebrations. Increase School Council Fee from \$27 to \$30.
Resulting Action:	Change in school fees
Responsibility:	Board and Superintendent

SCHOOL FEES

(Mandatory Fees -Approved by Board of Trustees) (Program/Optional Fees-Approved by Superintendent of Schools)

Background

Some school fees, other than tuition are necessary for schools to recover the cost of instructional materials, supplies and resources. In order to provide for consistency throughout the Division, the Board or the Superintendent of Schools will continue to set school fees.

The Division will endeavor to keep school fees assessed students to a minimum.

Procedures

- **1.** The Board will annually review and set instructional materials, supplies, and resource fees as part of the budget process.
- 2. Schools are authorized, with Superintendent approval, to establish additional fees for a course, activity, project or item on a cost recovery basis only.
- 3. Schools will collect and be credited the fees as part of their revenue.

3.1 Principals will be responsible to collect all mandatory fees and forward them to the Secretary-Treasurer or designate

- **3.** The collection of all school fees is the responsibility of the school.
- 4. Schools will make provisions for those circumstances where families cannot afford to pay school fees. Students whose families cannot afford school fees must not be penalized or prohibited from participation in programs. These provisions are to be communicated clearly to staff and students.
- 5. During the budget preparation process, in consultation with school staff and the School Council, the principal will develop a recommendation and rationale for the upcoming year's school fees. This recommendation and rationale will be provided to the Superintendent on or before March 1 of each year.
- 6. After due consideration, and before March 30 of each year, the Board will determine the school fees for the upcoming year.
- **7.** Schools shall advise parents of the amount and purpose of approved school fees prior to or at the time of registration.



- 8. School fees for elementary and middle schools are due and payable on the first day of classes for the school year, and for high schools, on the first day of each semester.
- **9.** Parents requesting waivers of fees must do so through the office of the Superintendent.
- **10.** Unpaid school fees will be subject to a collections process.

Background: Curriculum changes are occurring for religious education.

Elementary and Junior high changes are being made to take advantage of current technology, provide more student interaction, more engaging text, wider choice of activities.

At the high school level a new course has been developed to reflect Blessed John XXIII's vision of "seeking unity within the Church with Christians separated from Catholicism, with those of non-Christian religions, and with all men and women of goodwill." (Vatican II)

Recommendation /Decision:

Elementary & Jr. High: AB, Sask. and Ont. Bishops have formally decided to collaborate to create new resources for K-9. They are looking at developing 2 grades per year. This may be a current resource or a new resource that Pearson or Novalis will publish. It will be a digital program with books to support it. We know that the new program will use the 6 tasks of the General Directory for Catechesis (GDC): knowledge of faith, moral formation, prayer, participating in a Christian community, social justice (mission), liturgy & sacraments.

High School Religion: The new World Religions 30 course has been approved by AB Ed and has been made a **mandatory** course. All Catholic schools must offer it. This means that we will need to look at the sequencing and availability of the courses we want to offer. WR 30 is designed to be taken in grade 11 or grade 12. An outline has been attached. This course is intended to compare non-Christian religions with Catholicism.

Resulting Action:

Elementary/Jr High: this new curriculum won't be available for the foreseeable future; therefore the Bishop has asked that each division create a bridge to the new program. Bishop Henry wants the current program outcomes to be organized into the 6 tasks.

High School Religion: There have been some Catholic school divisions who have piloted the World Religions 30 course. Some parents within these divisions have questioned the purpose for teaching these religions in a Catholic school. Bishop Henry will be writing a formal letter expressing his approval of this course in reference to the intent of Vatican II. Monsignor McCoy will need to decide how best to sequence its religious education courses beginning in the fall of 2013.

<u>Responsibility</u>: Elementary and Junior High bridging of curriculum – Jill Wilkinson and REN committee members.

High School – Monsignor McCoy administration and religion teacher

Outline of World Religions 30

Chapter 1: World Religions and Religious Pluralism

Focus: What are the goals of dialogue? How do we engage in dialogue? What are the four types of dialogue? (Each subsequent chapter concludes with a section on inter-religious dialogue).

Chapter 2: Who Are Catholics?

Focus: Review of Catholic beliefs and practices.

Chapter 3: The Story of Canadian Aboriginal Spirituality

Focus: The spirituality and spiritual traditions of Aboriginal peoples in Canada.

Chapter 4: The Story of Judaism

Focus: The Catholic faith emerged from Judaism. The life, death and resurrection of Jesus and the teachings of the New Testament are understood as deeply rooted in the sacred tradition of Hebrew Scripture.

Chapter 6: The Story of Islam

Focus: Islam is one of the fastest growing religions in Canada. Like Judaism and Christianity, Islam traces its roots back to Abraham.

Chapter 7: The Story of Hinduism

Focus: Introduction of vocabulary of Hinduism; Hindu and Catholic relations in the life of Gandhi and Christian missionaries will be of particular interest.

Chapter 8: The Story of Buddhism

Focus: The life of the founder, Siddhartha Gautama, and the historical development of different forms of Buddhism. Various rituals, central beliefs, moral guidelines and family life will be discussed. The chapter concludes with a section on the relationship between the Catholic Church and Buddhism.

Chapter 9: The Story of Sikhism

Focus: Sikh beliefs and their relationship to the beliefs of Hinduism and Islam. The Sikh code of moral conduct and its emphasis on social justice and equality.

Chapter 10: Modernity and Religion

Focus: The numerous movements, trends, and beliefs that have developed in the wake of globalization (modernity) and the influence that modernity and religion have had on each other and on life in Canada.

Chapter 11: Living Faith Today

Focus: Review of key concepts discussed throughout the text. Exploration of ways to become involved in ecumenical and inter-religious dialogue.

Background: One way to connect our schools to the parish is through sacramental preparation. Currently the sacramental coordinator communicates through our schools through newsletters, registration inserts, and information nights. Many of our teachers are involved in the teaching of the Sacraments. <u>Resulting Action</u>: meeting between Sally Myers, Sacrament coordinator for Holy Family and St. Patrick's, was held on Friday, February 8, 2013 to discuss and plan revisions to current sacrament program in light of recommendations from Kathleen Nguyen. It was also decided that attending the workshop would provide practical ideas to enhance the current program.

Subsequent meeting with Fr. Philip to make recommendations for revisions will be planned.

BOUNDARIES AND ATTENDANCE AREAS

Background

School boundaries and attendance areas have become blurred with the implementation of the Alberta Schools Foundation Fund. It is necessary for the Division to designate boundaries and attendance areas to determine transportation routes and to provide for effective use of school facilities. Shifts in population and the growth of the City will necessitate the modification of school boundaries from time to time. At all times the Division considers the best interests of students and families when designating boundaries and attendance areas.

School boundaries and attendance areas will be designated to maintain class enrolments within reasonable limits, to determine transportation requirements and to provide for effective use of school facilities.

Procedures

- 1. The Division shall determine modification of boundaries and attendance areas not later than March 31 for the following school year.
- 2. The Division will consult broadly with all stakeholder groups when considering boundary changes.
- 3. Requests for a student or students to attend a school other than the designated school are to be made to the receiving school principal.
- 4. When making the decision, the principal shall determine whether the school has sufficient resources and facilities to accommodate the request.
- 5. The Division will provide transportation to students within Alberta Education guidelines and the Division procedures. Transportation to a school other than the school designated is not the responsibility of the Division. Transportation will be provided for these students only when there is space available on an existing school bus.






