PRESENTATION -LEARNING SERVICES

Mr. Hugh Lehr, Associate Superintendent of Learning Services, introduced Mrs. Monica Braat, Teacher and Inclusive Education Facilitator in our School Division. Mrs. Braat presented information on the *Literacy for All Initiative*. The project is designed for teachers of students with significant disabilities. We have 30 teachers participating across the Province of Alberta collaborating using an online community model. The goals of the project are to: *Enhance the capacity of participating teachers to better meet the diverse learning needs of students with significant disabilities; Create a provincial community of practice to analyze the effectiveness and appropriateness of the*



effectiveness and appropriateness of the MEville to WEville literacy and communication teacher resource in the Alberta context, Support and build teacher understanding of literacy and communication strategies for students with significant disabilities. The Board acknowledges the

many efforts being made in our Division to support student learning.

BOUNDARY REVIEW – The Board work plan indicates the Board will annually review school boundaries and attendance zones in an effort to seek balanced utilization and cost efficiencies. Any changes to boundaries or attendance zones must be made prior to the annual February registration. The Board of Trustees has passed a motion which directs Senior Administration to seek stakeholder input to review school boundaries and attendance zones and to provide a report to the Board. Administration will engage our school community at the upcoming Town Hall Meeting; at which time Administration will communicate the proposed recommendations for boundary changes.

HUMAN PAPILLOMAVIRUS VACCINATION - The Board of Trustees recently passed a motion which directs Senior Administration to *commence a consultation process with parents* to seek input with respect to the offering of the *HPV vaccine* in Division schools. The Board voted on the motion resulting in 4 Trustees in favor and 1 Trustee opposed. Mr. Peter Grad, Board Chair voted against the motion. The vote was recorded. The Board will engage stakeholder input at the upcoming Town Hall Meeting.

21,2013 – The Division is focused on providing effective and efficient operations for the Division and wishes to engage our community stakeholders in meaningful dialogue about issues affecting Catholic Education. A Town Hall Meeting is scheduled to allow Senior

BRING YOUR OWN DEVICE (BYOD) -

What is BYOD? The Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education is excited to introduce a new initiative where students will be able to bring their own technology device to school for the purpose of learning. This is a growing trend in education and we are now on-board. Presently we have 11



teachers at 5 different schools including Elementary, Middle School & High School piloting this project. A parent information evening was held in early December 2012 to provide the details around this initiative. The Board is currently *developing appropriate use practices* including *User Agreements* and *Digital Citizenship Agreements*.
