### PRESENTATION -LEARNING SERVICES



Mr. Hugh Lehr, Associate Superintendent Learning Services, introduced Teachers, Mrs. Natasha Taylor, Mrs. Deanna Burzminski and Mr. Lon Bosch who were in attendance to educate the Board of Trustees about the practical

application of **Differentiated Instruction** in our Catholic Schools. Also known as D.I. - this Alberta Initiative for School Improvement provides the opportunity for every student to be engaged in the classroom by offering them choices to meet their individual learning needs through strategic assessment, thoughtful planning and targeted, flexible instruction. In addition, each School now has a Learning Coach who provides support to the classroom teacher thus creating the opportunity to co-teach and to implement the best practices of Differentiated Instruction. Teachers learn how to design "tiered" lessons, they might also set the stage for their classrooms using particular colors, lighting and design to allow students to be less distracted and more attentive. Students are also provided with self-regulating tools to help regulate stimulus they experience in the classroom. Differentiated Instruction is helping our Schools meet the mandates set by the Province of Alberta on Inclusive Education. Our Teachers are collaborating and sharing promising practices as part of a Learning Support Team and as a result building capacity within our schools.

**Diversity in our Schools, Our Journey to Inclusion...** Did you know that **MHCBE** is also engaged at the Provincial Level in piloting a number of initiatives for Alberta Education? In addition to Differentiated Instruction and Learning Coaches *we are* 



excited to be involved in piloting the following programs:

- ▼Inclusive Education Planning Tool A digital resource to help Teachers enhance their instructional practice to better meet the diverse learning needs of all students. St. Michael's School MH and Notre Dame Academy are involved in the pilot program.
- Advancing Adolescent Reading Initiative A comprehensive Professional Development Program for (Gr 7-12) Alberta educators to teach reading skills and implement evidence-based reading instruction and intervention. *Monsignor McCoy High School* is piloting.
- Eliteracy for All Initiative To build Teacher capacity to better meet the literacy and communication needs of (Gr 1-6) students identified with significant disabilities. St. Michael's School, MH is piloting.
- **Numeracy for All Initiative** —To build Teacher capacity to better meet the numeracy needs of (Gr 1-6) students with significant disabilities. **St. Louis School** is piloting this program.
