The following information is provided to parents for declaring aboriginal status with the Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education.

Parents are required to complete a yearly registration form with Medicine Hat and Bow Island Catholic Schools. The registration form requires a collection of personal information including a declaration for Aboriginal descent. All personal information collected is kept confidential and is collected under the guidelines of the Freedom of Information and Protection of Privacy Act (FOIP).

The Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education uses the declaration in order to provide appropriate educational programming and services that support students, parents and families. We are committed to improving educational outcomes for First Nations, Métis and Inuit students by engaging families and supporting students through programming enhancement, resource development and collaboration with community partners as part of our collaborative service delivery model. The information is valuable for maintaining and improving programs affiliated with FNMI education.

Alberta Education provides separate funding to Medicine Hat Catholic Board of Education for every FNMI student currently being educated in our schools. The funding is then directly applied to FNMI education and programs.
