Education Delivery for Students

We are aware that all schools are different and have families with differing needs. We feel that teachers are in the best place to determine the needs of their students. Teachers, in close consultation with school principals, will work together to determine the best ways to serve our families. We are extremely proud of our staff who are working to produce quality education for our students. We are confident in our approach to delivering programming.

Students and families can expect a phone call or email check-in from their teacher early next week to discuss learning options for your child. Teachers will be in contact with families on a regular basis throughout the remainder of the school year to help students navigate this new delivery of education.

The next few months will require schools, students and parents to work closely together in order to create the best learning experience possible. It is only through our combined efforts that we will be truly successful!

Working Locations for Staff

As of Friday, March 20th, we will not require staff to work at their schools. Rather, staff will be able to work from home. This is based on recommendations from Alberta's Chief Medical Officer of Health. This date has been set to help reduce opportunities for interaction as a way to stop the spread of COVID-19. We must all do our part to stop the spread and stay healthy.

Parents/guardians and students are reminded to pick up all belongings by the end of the day on Friday (or as instructed by your child's school). After this day, access to the school will be limited.
