LETTER OF INTENT – NATIONAL DAY FOR TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION

ARTICLE 18 - STATUTARY HOLIDAYS

Whereas on June 9, 2021, Employment and Social Development Canada (ESDC) emailed stakeholders advising them that the implementation of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission's Call to Action 80 (legislation introduced on September 29, 2020, to establish National Day for Truth and Reconciliation for workers) received royal assent on June 3, 2021. This legislation comes into force on August 3, 2021.

And whereas Article 18 Statutary Holidays specifically 18.01 a. states:

Family Day (3rd Monday in February)

Good Friday

Victoria Day

Easter Monday

Truth & Reconciliation Day

Thanksgiving Day

Canada Day

Labour Day

and all general holidays proclaimed by the City of Medicine Hat, the province of Alberta or the Government of Canada.

Therefore, the parties agree that the National Day for Truth and Reconciliation, September 30 or as designated, will be added to the list of Statutory Holidays.

Furthermore, the parties agree that until the day is recognized by the Government of Alberta, the Employees shall not receive September 30th as the Statutory Holiday but shall receive a day in lieu to be taken when the school is not in operation.
