INTRODUCTION

St. Francis Xavier School has a school population of 114 in grades K-6. We are also proud to offer both a morning and an afternoon Early Learning Program (ELP). This program is designed for children who are either not school aged or wish to attend ½ day in addition to their morning kindergarten programming.

We are home to Southern Alberta's only grades 4-6 Sports Academy, which promotes an active lifestyle both within the school and outside of school hours. Our multi-sports Academy challenges our students to engage in activities that promote inclusivity, such as: wheelchair basketball, rock climbing, and water polo, while also focusing on traditional sports like baseball, soccer, basketball and volleyball. The Academy runs for two afternoons every week, using facilities at the school, Monsignor McCoy High School, Big Marble Go Centre and throughout the Medicine Hat community. The optional Sports Academy program aligns with the school's dedication to an increase in physical literacy and is taught by teachers and community supports.

St. Francis School is lucky to have assistance from outside service agencies around our city to support the needs of all our children. Occupational therapy, physical therapy, speech therapy, counselors, Community Coming Together (CCT), Medicine Hat Police, and Big Brother and Big Sisters are all integral parts of our school community. By working together, we support the needs of all students while embracing their personality and self growth.

The promotion of an active healthy lifestyle can also be seen in our Alberta Education Nutrition program, ongoing work with Ever Active Schools, daily physical activity, and our out of school care (OSC) program. We are lucky enough to have support for daily breakfast for all students in need of one. As we strive to be an active school community, nutrition and a healthy balanced diet help us reach this goal. In addition, students who need morning or afternoon out of school care are able to do so while engaging in various activities throughout this time.

We are also proud of our diverse learners here at St. Francis. As the education system changes to accommodate the average learner, students who struggle with self-regulation, English Language Learners (ELL) and students with significant needs and disabilities, as does St. Francis School. We offer students the opportunity to strive for excellence, in whatever capacity that may look like for that given student.

At St. Francis Xavier School we envision a place where students, staff, parents, and community form a Christian family. We work to ensure that the individual needs of students are met in an atmosphere of Faith, Hope, Trust and Love. 
ASSURANCE

Assurance in the education system happens when community members, system stakeholders and education partners engage across five domains:

- 1. Student Growth and Achievement
- 2. Teaching and Leading
- 3. Learning Supports
- 4. Governance
- 5. Local and Societal Context

For the purposes of this document, a domain is an area of activity where education partners have specific responsibilities that they are accountable for and provide assurance about. Fundamentally, assurance is reflected in what the public understands, perceives and knows about student growth and achievement, where the quality of the daily interaction between teacher and student is paramount. Assuring the public that the education system is successfully supporting student growth and achievement requires engagement and thoughtful action across all five domains.

Student growth and achievement is the primary purpose of the education system and is the core outcome domain for the assurance framework. The domains of Teaching and Leading, Learning Supports and Governance support and enable Student Growth and Achievement. Local and Societal Context, while a separate domain, operates across and is integrated into the others. For the purposes of description, the domains are considered discrete and separate. However, in practice, they overlap and are interconnected and interdependent, as depicted in the graphic below:

Goal #1

To promote and recognize kindness and caring for all staff and students.

Goal #2

To allow students the opportunity to grow in their faith by actively participating in meaningful prayer and reflection.

Goal #3

Engage the parent community of St. Francis by promoting a healthy active faith journey with their children

Implementation Specifics:

- Kindness Champions awards for good works around the school
- Presentations promoting Kindness Champions and their work within the school
- Allow students to participate in prayer throughout the day over the announcements,
 within their classrooms and by promoting faith leadership opportunities
- Engage staff, students and parents in assemblies by providing hands-on activities that promote a healthy active faith journey
- Prayer leaders for assemblies (student led group)
- 'Strong Inside Strong Outside' motto emphasized
- Faith portion of Parent Council meetings will be meaningful and promote faith growth

Outcomes:

- 1. Staff, students and parents will recognize one another as Kindness Champions within the school community
- 2. Parents will grow in their faith journeys as active members within the school and church
- 3. All staff and students continue to embrace the 'Strong Inside Strong Outside' motto and truly grow closer to God through daily prayer and reflection within the school community



Health and Wellness

Goal #1

To use Zones of Regulation as a model to foster regulation and emotional control.

Goal #2

To engage in physical literacy and promote a healthy active lifestyle.

Implementation Specifics:

- Continue Zones of Regulation lessons that guide the teacher to promote self regulation and how to recognize this independently
- Guide students who struggle with regulation by engaging in activity breaks
- Regulation check-ins with students
- Continue relationship with Ever Active Schools (Done Walk in the Hallway initiative)
- Promote lessons that engage students in movement and body awareness
- Physical literacy component in assemblies and school events

Outcomes:

- 1. Staff will learn and implement the Zones of Regulation curriculum designed to foster self-regulation and emotional control
- 2. Students will recognize the Zones and engage in activities to help themselves with self-regulation within the classroom
- 3. Physical literacy will be embraced by all staff and students while understanding the importance of becoming physically literate

Health and Wellness Components





Quality Teaching and Learning

Goal #1

To increase data collection of literacy and numeracy needs in Grades 1-6 while creating an intervention program for students who are struggling.

Goal #2

To implement reading programs and provide resources that engage students and promote a meaningful reading life.

Implementation Specifics:

- Continue our work with the Alberta Government 'Close the Gap' program (Grades 1-4)
- Pre and post assessments completed and documented signifying growth in both literacy and numeracy
- Programs in place for those struggling in areas of need
- Students accessibility to literacy and mathematics resources both in and outside of the classroom (Raz-Kids, Mathletics etc.)
- Reading buddy programs for K-6
- Designated DEAR (drop everything and read) time for all classrooms promoting independent reading
- Active participation of reading in assemblies and school events

Outcomes:

- 1. Staff and students will embrace the school reading initiative and grow in their own 'Reading Life'
- 2. Literacy and mathematics focus will increase testing scores in provincial testing and report card scores
- 3. Reading will become a significant part of student life at St. Francis and visitors will witness the growth of all students' love for reading
