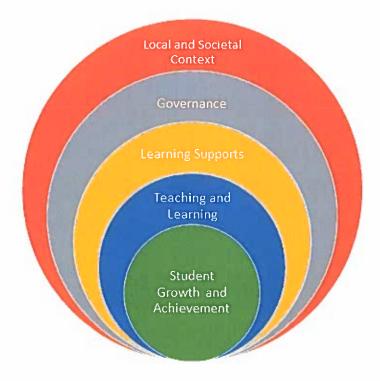
ASSURANCE

Assurance in the education system happens when community members, system stakeholders and education partners engage across five domains:

- 1. Student Growth and Achievement
- 2. Teaching and Leading
- 3. Learning Supports
- 4. Governance
- 5. Local and Societal Context

For the purposes of this document, a domain is an area of activity where education partners have specific responsibilities that they are accountable for and provide assurance about. Fundamentally, assurance is reflected in what the public understands, perceives and knows about student growth and achievement, where the quality of the daily interaction between teacher and student is paramount. Assuring the public that the education system is successfully supporting student growth and achievement requires engagement and thoughtful action across all five domains.

Student growth and achievement is the primary purpose of the education system and is the core outcome domain for the assurance framework. The domains of Teaching and Leading, Learning Supports and Governance support and enable Student Growth and Achievement. Local and Societal Context, while a separate domain, operates across and is integrated into the others. For the purposes of description, the domains are considered discrete and separate. However, in practice, they overlap and are interconnected and interdependent, as depicted in the graphic below:



ENGAGEMENT

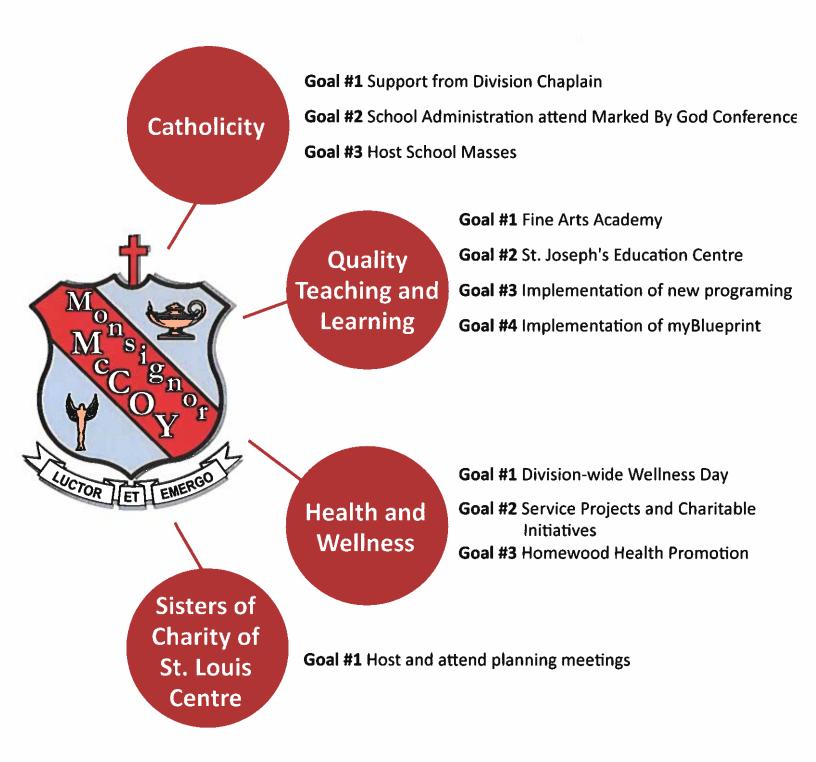
Over the past few years, Alberta Education Assurance Measures and Accountability Pillar Results have shown low Parental Involvement numbers relative to provincial results. As a result, we have developed a number of strategies to help address this concern. In the most recent results, we are pleased to see that Monsignor McCoy High School's Parental Involvement data is 7% above the provincial average. This is encouraging, and we will continue to implement strategies that we believe contribute to engagement in our school. Strategies that we will implement this year include the following:

School Content Stories: Short text items will discuss a wide variety of items about the school including programming and staff. These items will be sent to the Communication Coordinator where they will be augmented with photos and infographics to be posted at regular intervals throughout the school year. Beyond engaging our parents and students, another goal is to reach a wider audience of parents and students who may be interested in registering at McCoy.

Survey: A short survey will be created and sent to our parent community. The questions will be designed to ask them for their input on developing effective strategies to engage and communicate with them on an ongoing basis. As well, we will ask parents if they have programming ideas, and interest in volunteering at our school.

Social Media: In order to improve the frequency and broaden the types of school activities that we post to the school's social media platforms, we are going to recruit a small number of students to create content from curricular student activities to extracurricular games and performances. This information will be sent to one of our teachers who will review the content before posting. We are planning to provide credits through Work Experience to honor the time and energy these students will be committing to this work.

Promotional Poster: A variety of school photos will be sent to the Communication Coordinator. She will work with Boylan Imaging to create vinyl posters that will be placed in all Division schools on an ongoing basis. This will act as a tool to raise McCoy's profile among our Division students and staff, and ideally lead to increased enrollment in future years.



SCHOOL GOALS AND IMPLEMENTATION SPECIFICS



Goal #1 Host Division Chaplain and get regular support from the chaplain for student activities including religious celebrations and a Bible Study Group

Goal #2 School Administration attend Marked by God Conference

Goal #3 Host School Masses

Implementation Specifics:

- Offer the Chaplain a classroom to use on a continual basis to meet with students and staff, and to lead bible study group meetings and activities.
- Invite the Chaplain to be a part of the planning and leadership of school celebrations and daily prayer and reflection.
- School administration will attend the Marked by God Conference in Red Deer.
- Hold school masses for each grade level in the gym led by one of our parish priests, and involving our students and chaplain.

Implementation Specifics:

- McCoy's Fine Arts Academy invites students to take part in eight different fine arts programs. This year we will hold meetings to refine the Fine Arts Academy program pathways and outcomes, including calculating staffing needs, and communicating this information to stakeholders.
- Monsignor McCoy's outreach program, St. Joseph's Education Centre, continues to be evaluated, as it evolves to best support the needs of our students. One of the strategies to enhance the effectiveness of the online programming offered through St. Joseph's Education Centre is to take greater control over the implementation and assessment of these courses. ADLC programming came to an end in June, 2021. The remaining online schools provide significant limitations and challenges to our ability to register for and offer these types of courses to our students throughout the year. To this end, we will continue to spend time and money on this development.
- Course development and student interest surveying will take place for the potential of offering the following courses in the 2023-2024 school year: Aesthetics, Student Leadership, and Computer Science and Coding.
- McCoy will purchase access to the myBlueprint program which supports students in a
 myriad of ways. The program will allow all of our students to achieve many of their goals
 throughout high school: from career exploration and planning, to registering for high
 school courses, to post-secondary scholarships and requirements. Staff PD will be
 supplied as part of this arrangement.

Implementation Specifics:

- All school staff will attend, and some staff will lead sessions in the morning of the Division Wellness Day.
- Groups of students will be organized in conjunction with our international students to support our community in initiatives such as Power of Ten. Also, annual activities will take place throughout the school by our students and staff to support members of our school and larger community, such as organizing the collection of donations and the delivery of Christmas hampers, and collecting funds for Mission Mexico.
- School administrators will review the resources offered to school staff by Homewood Health, and feature specific areas at staff meetings, as well as email this information to all staff.

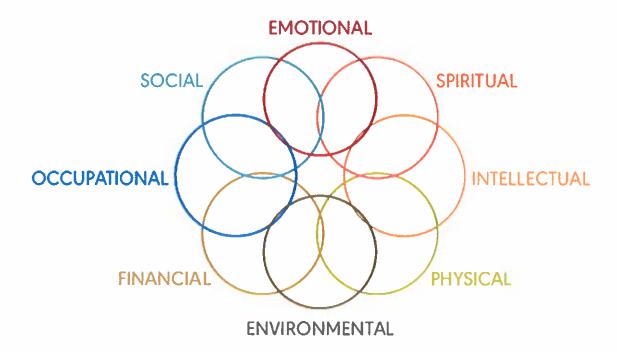
Goal #1 Host regularly scheduled meetings for the Sisters of Charity of St. Louis

Safe and Caring Schools

Encourage school staff to receive SIVA, VTRA, and complex communication training.

Provide a continuum of support through school teams: counselors, mental health workers, CCT, teachers, administration.

School administration meet weekly to discuss students who are struggling to be successful, and develop success plans.

Survey students to better understand the types of challenges they are facing, and the types of support they require.

91.3% of students, parents, and teachers either Agree or Strongly Agree that students are safe at school, are learning the importance of caring for others, are learning respect for others, and are treated fairly in school. This compares to 88.8% from students, parents, and teachers in the rest of the province. A positive difference of 2.5%

Student Learning Opportunities

Clevr training and support for all McCoy teachers Implementation of St. Joseph's Education Centre. Implementation of Fine Arts Academy.

Design of new timetable including COLT and Flex time.

School admin. meet weekly to discuss struggling students, and develop success plans.

84.5% of students, parents, and teachers either Agree or Strongly Agree that they are satisfied with the opportunity for students to receive a broad program of studies including fine arts, career, technology, and health and physical education. This compares with 82.9% of students, parents, and teachers in the rest of the province. A positive difference of 1.6%

Student Learning Achievement

Testing/Retesting area supervised at all times, including opportunities to test using a reader. Credit Recovery opportunities for students at the end of each semester.

St. Joseph's Education Centre available to all students to complete school work, access teacher support, or register for online courses.

88.7% of students, parents, and teachers either Agree or Strongly Agree that their learning environments are welcoming, caring, respectful and safe. This compares with 86.1% of students, parents, and teachers in the rest of the province. A positive difference of 2.6%.

Preparation for Lifelong Learning, Citizenship, and World of Work

Develop a web portal with resources for faith support in the home, school, and parish. Moving Forward With High School Redesign Strategies including flex time and credit recovery allows students to learn how to manage their time, advocate for themselves, and plan for their own success.

93.8% of students, parents, and teachers Agree or Strongly Agree that students demonstrate the knowledge, skills and attitudes necessary for lifelong learning. This compares with 81.0% of students, teachers, and parents in the rest of the province. A positive difference of 12.8%.

82.6% of students, parents, and teachers either Agree or Strongly Agree that students model the characteristics of active citizenship. This compares with 81.4% students, parents, and teachers in the rest of the province. A positive difference of 1.2%.

Parental Involvement

Survey parents about ideas they have regarding programming opportunities, as well as ways in which they may want to volunteer at McCoy. Create content stories supported by infographics to be posted on social media platforms on a regular basis.

Develop a small group of students who take videos and photos from wide-ranging student activities to be sent to a teacher, then posted on social media platforms.

85.8% of students, parents, and teachers Agree or Strongly Agree that parents are satisfied with their level of involvement in decisions about their child's education. This compares with 78.8% of students, parents, and teachers in the rest of the province. A positive difference of 7%

Continuous Improvement

Implementation of St. Joseph's Education Centre. Implementation of Fine Arts Academy. Planning for McCoy online programming for the 2022-2023 school year.

Hold bi-annual team lead/admin meetings.

80% of students, parents, and teachers either Agree or Strongly Agree that Monsignor McCoy High School and schools in the Medicine Hat Catholic School Division have improved or stayed the same in the last three years. This compares with 74.2% from students in the rest of the province. A positive difference of 5.8%.
